







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2018 Goals

Below are some goals that we will try and complete during 2018. Some of these will be ongoing due to the nature of the project.

1. Complete and put into service Station #7 (Frogtown). This would allow us to fulfill the Automatic aid agreement with White County.
2. Get BOC approval to add and install 2 new Dry Hydrants to help improve the County's ISO rating.
3. Get BOC approval to add two more Firefighter positions (6 people). This will allow us to fully staff another station.
4. Host another EMT class in house.
5. Host another Volunteer Recruit class.
6. Get BOC approval to improve the vacation accrual rate for the 24-hour shift personnel (They are currently base on a 40 hour per week employee).
7. Complete the Generator Grant that has been ongoing for two years.
8. Continue working on my Advance Certified Emergency Manager certification and other areas that will make me a better Director for the County and this department.
9. Continue to stream line and make LCES the best department ever.

Some of these goals will be hard to achieve, but I feel that they are possible and very important to keep this department moving forward. Our Citizens deserve the best that we can offer and we will continue to do everything we can to make this happen.


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2018 Accomplishments

Below are some of the accomplishments that were completed during 2018. Some items that were started in 2018 are still ongoing and will be completed in 2019.

1. Lowered the Counties ISO rating to a class "5". Hope to lower to a class "4" in 2019, to include the City.
2. Built and put into service Frogtown Station #7. Hope to man in 2019.
3. Manned Mill Creek Station #5.
4. Received SAFER grant. Hired 9 new Firefighters. Enabled us to man Station #5 and Station #7 when it is completed.
5. Purchased 12 new air packs through SPLOST SCBA replacement project.
6. Purchased and put into service new Fire Engine (Engine #5). SPLOST
7. Purchased and put into service new Ambulance (Med #2). SPLOST
8. Received a \$10,000.00 Wildland Firefighter Grant.
9. Received Car Seat Grant, which will let us continue to give and install new seats.
10. Re located and put into service 1 new Dry Hydrant (Turners Corner).
11. Started another EMT and Volunteer Firefighter recruit class. Largest class ever (24 students and 4 students are from White County).
12. Was able to negotiate and work through all of FEMA and GEMA paper work to get the county reimburse for the money spent during the IRMA storm.
13. Purchased and put into service our Wildland-Disaster response vehicle for \$100.00 through the U.S. Forest Service.
14. With the guidance and help of You and Perry this year, I have been able to improve my leadership skills, behavior, and thinking, which in turn I feel has improved the overall operations of the department. Thank you for this.

As you can see, this has been a very busy year for our Department. I am very proud of everyone involved in these accomplishments, it took all of us to make it happen.






Incidents by District
Alarm Date Between {01/01/2018} And {12/31/2018}




NFIRS Incidents by Response Time (in minutes)
Alarm Date Between {01/01/2018} And {12/31/2018}




Count of Incidents by Alarm Hour
Alarm Date Between {01/01/2018} And {12/31/2018}




Average Minutes to Respond by Incident Type


Volunteer Division 2018


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2019 Goals
