



2009 UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION CONCLUSION STATEMENT

The Uniform Patrol Division operated under its allotted 2009 budget this year, relinquishing approximately \$190,000.00 back to the county.

The Uniform Patrol Division currently maintains (30) thirty vehicles. Seven (7) of those vehicles currently have over 200,000 miles. Out of those seven vehicles, one has over 260,000 miles. These seven vehicles have cost Lumpkin County approximately \$12,487.00 in vehicle maintenance during the 2009 budget year. These expenditures are approximately one third of the Uniform Patrol Divisions operational vehicle maintenance budget.

This year, the Uniform Patrol Division has had (9) nine employee's voluntarily resign, and seek employment elsewhere. One employee was terminated for misconduct. The division hired (7) seven employee's throughout the year, and (9) nine Detention Deputies were transferred from the Detention Center into the division. The division operated a three district concept this year, covering three districts with the scheduled minimum manpower of three Deputies for approximately 72% of the scheduled work time.

This year, the Uniform Patrol Division responded to (9) nine motor vehicle fatalities, one of which two people were fatally wounded who were traveling in the same vehicle. The average age of the people fatally wounded in motor vehicle fatalities this year was (38) thirty eight years of age. Out of the nine traffic fatalities, (8) eight people were not wearing seatbelts, and (1) one person was hit outside of his vehicle.

This year, Uniform Patrol Division personnel acquired approximately (6,512) six thousand five hundred and twelve training hours. The division sponsored (7) seven deputies, who attended the full time police academy (North Georgia Regional Police Academy). The division sponsored (1) one deputy, who attended the part time police academy (North Georgia Regional Police Academy). The division sponsored one deputy, who attended and received a certification from the police work dog training academy (Chatham County Regional K-9 Training Center, Savannah, Georgia).

The Uniform Patrol Division generated (1) one use of force report during the 2009 calendar year. During a call for service, William Smith became defiant during a conversation with Sgt. E. Cole. Mr. Smith made threats to take his own life, and Sgt. E. Cole attempted to take Mr. Smith into custody. As Sgt. E. Cole attempted to restrain Mr. Smith, Mr. Smith resisted. Sgt. E. Cole utilized an arm bar takedown, and escorted Mr. Smith to the ground. On the ground, Mr. Smith was handcuffed. Subsequent to the events, Mr. Smith sustained a laceration on his forearm and on his forehead. Mr. Smith was ultimately transported to Chestatee Regional Hospital, where a report of a peace officer was completed.

In closing, the below listed information is the Uniform Patrol Division (5) five year plan:

The Uniform Patrol Division serves a static population in a rural environment, consisting of approximately 30,000 citizens. This does not include tourists or the population of the college and motorists moving in and out of the County. The officers have a responsibility for approximately 287.5 miles of geographic.

Staffing:

Current (2009)

27 Patrol Officers (including) Commander

Currently national standards indicate a ratio of $(1.8 \times 30,000 = 54)$ sworn officers. Overall, the Lumpkin County Sheriff's Office staffs 57 sworn certified officers, this leaves a shortfall of 3 sworn certified officers. With this staffing the Sheriff's Office should attribute 3 officers short within the Uniform Patrol Division

Five-Year Plan (2014) Population estimation of 35,000

$(1.8 \times 35,000 = 63)$ with this increase an additional 6 officers will be needed to respond to calls for service and for traffic enforcement within Lumpkin County. **(Patrol 33)**

Equipment: (Fleet)

Current (2009)

Fleet: 25 Patrol Vehicles operating 12 hour shifts, 7 days per week. Yearly maintenance on Patrol Fleet is \$41,691.61 Dollars annual, and a daily mileage of between 230 and 250 miles driven per vehicle in service.

Five-Year Plan (2014)

Increase of calls for service and traffic congestion will require more miles driven. Patrol fleet will be designated or take-home to extend the life of the vehicles and to decrease the cost of maintenance.

Patrol Vehicles needed (6 new vehicles annually).

Implementation Plan: Hold (6) vehicles per year and reassign as designated or take-home vehicle. Maintain (6) vehicles purchased per year.

Equipment: (Weapons)

Currently, our Glock model 22, 40 cal. pistol is in use. This pistol is approximately 5 years old. Recommend an upgrade to a Smith & Wesson LE M&P 40 caliber pistol.

Recommend: Add Less-Lethal Taser. Each officer to carry less-lethal taser on reaction side of person to provide an additional option to the officer.
