

All courts must use the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) Predisposition Risk Assessment Instrument and Structured Decision Making Matrix to ensure that the appropriate youth are being recommended to receive grant-funded services. In order for a youth to be eligible for diversion into a grant funded evidenced-based program, they must score at a medium or high risk level on the PDRA. If a juvenile falls within one of the following classifications: Class A Designated Felony (low, medium, and high risk), Class B Designated Felony (medium and high risk), or Other Felony (medium and high risk) they are eligible for diversion into the funded evidence-based program.

No more than 30% of awarded grant funds can be used for administrative costs. Any requests to have funds allocated in a manner that does not comply with the 70/30 rule must be justified in a written statement and submitted to the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council with an adjustment request. The adjustment request and justification will be forwarded to the Juvenile Justice Funding Committee for consideration on a case-by-case basis.

Re: Enotah Family Therapy Program Grant

Dear Commissioners:

During the past year, your agreement to serve as fiscal agent for the Enotah Family Therapy Program grant has meant that \$100,000.00 in costs otherwise chargeable to the counties of our Circuit for alternatives to detention in delinquency cases. We now have the opportunity to receive a supplemental grant to assist in further defraying costs and to allow the provision of more services to our juveniles and their families.

As you may recall, we are using these funds to address by family therapy the root problems that cause many of our youth to commit crimes which may require detention in a secure facility. Detention is useful for short term personal and property protection, and to secure the attendance of youth at hearings where they have a history of flight risk, but does not provide long-term success for youth. In fact, the more often a youth is detained, the more likely he is to continue delinquent and adult criminal behavior.

We hope that by addressing the underlying causes of delinquent behavior, we will be helping to build stable families for our Circuit and avoid costly delinquency and criminal interventions. I hope that you will give your approval to act as fiscal agent for our grants. Item Description: The Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) has recently announced a grant award in the amount of \$9,800.00 to the County on behalf of the Enotah Family Therapy Program.

Facts & Historical Information: Earlier this year, the County submitted a Juvenile Justice Incentive Grant Program application to CJCC on behalf of the Enotah Family Therapy Program. While the County's application was selected to receive funding, CJCC made the decision to utilize two funding sources in order to fully fund the County's request. The first of these two sources provided \$90,200.00 of the requested \$100,000.00 and was accepted by the County in July 2014. The second source will provide the remaining \$9,800.00 in funding requested by the County.

Potential Courses of Action:

- A. Accept the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant on behalf of the Enotah Family Therapy Program.
- B. Take no action.

Budget Impact: There will be no impact to the County's budget as there is no matching requirement associated with the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant Award.
