Criminal Procedures involves the law relating to taking a person into custody in connection with a charge of violating a criminal law. The validity of an arrest has taken on a new meaning with the federal constitutional application of the exclusionary rule. In addition to arrests; stop and frisk, search and seizure and custodial interrogation will also be discussed. Through this training, the officer will sustain his knowledge in defining probable causes for arrests, immunity from arrests, procedures for arrests and current case law within the application of arrests and searches.

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is an emergency procedure which is performed in an effort to manually preserve intact brain function until further measures are taken to restore spontaneous blood circulation and breathing in a person in cardiac arrest. It is indicated in those who are unresponsive with no breathing or abnormal breathing.

An automated external defibrillator or AED is portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the potentially life threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and ventricular tachycardia in a patient and is able to treat them through defibrillation, the application of electrical therapy which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm.

Active shooter situations are unpredictable and evolve quickly; therefore the officer(s) must deploy and neutralize the threat immediately. T.
