Special projects/Major Projects For 2018

- Removed over 52 potentially hazardous trees from county roads, rights of way and public trails.
- Relocated the recycle containers from the county transfer station to the intersection of Morrison Moore Pkwy and Torrington Dr.
- Stockpiled a large quantity of dirt to be used to recap the old landfill site at a later date.
- Completed the hurricane Irma FEMA reimbursement project.
- Installed the septic system and completed setting the parking area up with base at Fire Station #7 to be paved by contractors.
- Demolition and clearing on swimming pool was completed to make way for the new Library.

General Maintenance:

Kept current with daily duties which include: cutting grass, side-arm mowing, clipping and building-up shoulders, cleaning ditches and culverts, grading and graveling roads, chipping right of way and keeping roadways open and passable during inclement weather.

- Transition the road department from a 100% reactive work force to a more proactive force that will be doing more preventive maintenance type work.
